Mark's Reflection

Today in our Gospel reading we have a well known parable that presents us with two challenges

We read in our gospel from Luke that Jesus is dining at the home of a Pharisee on the Sabbath. He notices how the guests are competing for the best seats, seeking honour and recognition. In response, He teaches two lessons: first, that true humility avoids self-promotion, and second, that true generosity is shown when we give without expecting repayment.

Jesus' words remind us that the Kingdom of God overturns the world's values. In society, people often seek status, recognition, or favours in return. But Jesus calls His followers to a different way: to sit in the lower place, to serve rather than to be served, and to invite those who cannot repay us—the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind.

This is not just about table etiquette—it's about the disposition of our hearts. When we humble ourselves, God is the one who lifts us up. When we give without expecting repayment, we reflect the selfless love of Christ Himself, who gave His life for us when we had nothing to offer in return.

The challenge of this Gospel is twofold:

- To examine whether we seek recognition, honour, or reward in our actions.
- To live out generosity and hospitality that mirrors God's unconditional love.

And finally, we are reminded that Jesus is pointing us to the banquet of the Kingdom, where the "least" are welcomed and where our reward comes not from human praise but from God.
