Mark's Reflection

As Advent draws to a close, we turn again to Mary — young, humble, and open-hearted — who receives the angel's astonishing message: "You will conceive and bear a son... and you shall call his name Jesus."

In this moment, all of salvation history hangs in the balance. God's plan of redemption waits upon the response of a young woman from Nazareth. And Mary's answer, quiet yet courageous, changes everything: "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word."

Her faith and obedience embody the very heart of Advent. While we have been preparing, watching, and waiting, Mary shows us what that readiness looks like — a willingness to say "yes" to God, even when the future is uncertain.

The fourth candle on the Advent wreath — often called the Candle of Love — reminds us that everything God does is rooted in love. The coming of Christ is not an idea or a ritual; it is the outpouring of divine love into human life. As Mary welcomed Christ into her womb, we are invited to welcome Him into our hearts and homes, that His love may take flesh in us.

Today as we find ourselves on the threshold of Christmas, may we, like Mary, make room for Christ with trust and quiet joy.

As we approach the celebration of Christ's birth, may your hearts be filled with peace, hope, and the deep assurance of God's love. May the light of Christ shine in your homes and in your lives, and may His coming bring renewal and joy to our parish family.

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.
