Mark's Reflection

The Blessing of Giving

Every good thing we have comes from God. Life, faith, hope, family, friendship, daily provision, and above all the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ are signs of God's generous love toward us. Christian giving begins with recognizing that we are first receivers of God's grace.

In a world that often encourages us to hold tightly to what we own, the Gospel invites us into a different way of living — a life marked by gratitude and generosity. Saint Paul reminds us that “God loves a cheerful giver” (2 Corinthians 9:7). Giving is not meant to be a burden placed upon us, but a joyful response to the blessings we have already received.

When we give, whether through our finances, our time, or our gifts, we reflect something of God's own character. Our generosity becomes an expression of faith and trust. It reminds us that our security is found not in possessions, but in God's faithful provision.

Giving also changes us. It softens our hearts, draws us away from selfishness, and helps us become more aware of the needs of others. In giving, we participate in the generous life of Christ himself, who gave everything for us upon the Cross.

This week, may we pause to give thanks for God's many blessings and prayerfully consider how our own generosity may become a witness to God's love in the world.
