Mark's Reflection

Today, the third Sunday in Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday, invites us to rejoice. The word "Gaudete" means "Rejoice", and today's Gospel gives us one of Scripture's most profound songs of joy — Mary's Magnificat.

When Mary learns that she will bear the Christ, her first response is praise: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour."

Mary rejoices not because life has become easy — far from it — but because she has recognised the faithfulness of God. Her song celebrates a God who lifts up the lowly, fills the hungry with good things, and remembers his promises. It is a song of hope that turns the world upside down.

In the middle of Advent's waiting, Mary's words remind us that God is already at work — bringing justice, mercy, and peace to those who long for it. Her joy is not naïve; it is the deep, courageous joy that grows from trust in God's purposes, even when the future is uncertain.

As we light the rose candle of joy today, we echo Mary's song. We, too, are called to magnify the Lord — to make God's love visible in our lives and our world. Advent joy is not only something we feel; it's something we live.

Let us pray this week
Almighty God,
you looked with favour on your servant Mary
and filled her with joy in your salvation.
Fill our hearts with the same joy,
that we may magnify your name
and bear witness to your love made flesh in Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.
